
Session met on January 20, 2014 and reports the following:

MISSION INTERPRETATION AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

TIM D'AURORA

As we begin the second month of 2014, we need to take the time to reflect on 2013. Financially, 2013 was a little disappointing. We began the year with a balance of \$15,829.23 which was an adjusted total that now includes all the accounts that make up the general fund. Before this accounting adjustment, it was \$2413.84. We ended the year with a balance of \$14,440.53 realizing a net shortage of \$1388.70. Besides our regular giving, this includes money from the Presbyterian Women, a hoagie sale, 2 spaghetti dinners, a basket auction, and Watt's Truck Show. So overall, we really had a significant deficit. We also came up a little short on our First Fruits pledge. We had to take \$647.35 from the general fund to fulfill our pledge to Presbytery. Our response to our special offerings was mixed. We exceeded our goal of \$850.00 for our One Great Hour of Sharing by \$92.96 and our goal of \$400.00 for the Peacemaking offering by \$37.00 but fell short of our goal of \$400.00 for our Pentecost offering by \$118.46 and our goal of \$450.00 for our Christmas Joy offering by \$35.00. We do appreciate the commitment made by everyone who supported these special offerings.

This is an important time in the life of Congruity. While the life of the Church is not centered on finances, but rather doing God's work, we have to be aware that it does take money to do much of this work. As a committee, we will strive to do a better job keeping everyone informed of our financial situation and of opportunities to improve it. It is our hope and prayer that 2014 will be a much healthier year financially.

We also want everyone to understand that being a good steward means not just giving money, but also means being involved. I'm sure everyone has heard the phrase, Giving of your Time, Talents, and Treasures. If you take the time to really think about it, this means giving of yourself to show you appreciate all the gifts God has given you. For us to be a successful Church, we need more people to get involved in all aspects of the Church's life. That doesn't mean you have to volunteer for every committee or participate in every event, but if we all increase our involvement even a little, than the results of our efforts will substantially increase. We all need to prayerfully consider what it is that God is calling us to do. How can we participate in doing His work? Everyone has something to offer. We all just need to take that next step and make it happen.

I know in my ramblings, I tend to concentrate on the financial aspects of MIS. I also realize that we need to be aware of our mission component as well. We do some great mission work and this year we will strive to do a better job of keeping everyone abreast of the mission activities. Thanks to everyone who participates in either mission work or fundraising for mission trips.
