MISSION INTERPRETATION AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

As you can see from the Treasurer's Report located elsewhere in this newsletter, we did not start 2014 off on a very strong note. In our general fund, our expenses exceeded our receipts by \$2,544.95. Our First Fruits giving fell behind by \$162.00. While we know the weather for January wasn't very good, these results are still somewhat disappointing. In last month's newsletter submission, we stated that we were going to try to make everyone more aware of our current financial condition. This is difficult when we are essentially working with information that will be over a month old by the time we get it to you. We are going to try to have an updated monthly snapshot as part of our announcement loop during one Sunday a month. We realize that this limits this information to those attending worship services, but it is a start. We also hope to utilize Presbytery's stewardship resources more effectively. This difficult financial climate is certainly not limited to Congruity but we still need to do our best to meet the needs of this congregation.

MIS has set the tentative dates for our spaghetti dinners and hoagie sales. The first spaghetti dinner will be on April 26th and the second one will be on November 8th or with the proceeds benefitting the general fund. The first hoagie sale will be on May 22nd benefitting the general fund and the second one will be on September 18th benefitting First Fruits. We look forward to your participation in these fundraisers.

We have set our goals for our Special Offerings for the year. Our goal for One Great Hour of Sharing is \$900.00, for the Pentecost Offering is \$400.00 with our designated 40% going to the Blackburn Center, for the Peacemaking Offering is \$400.00 with our designated 25% going to Welcome Home, and for the Christmas Joy Offering is \$450.00. We will continue to use Minutes for Mission to keep you informed on how donating to these worthy special offerings is doing great work. With your help, we can achieve and exceed these goals.

I am going to include a paragraph from last month's newsletter submisison because I believe it is so important for the future of our congregation. We want everyone to understand that being a good steward means not just giving money, but also means being involved. I'm sure everyone has heard the phrase, Giving of your Time, Talents, and Treasures.
