The Redstone Mission team just returned from a very productive trip to Point Pleasant Beach, New Jersey. There were 22 volunteers and we were divided into 4 work-groups at 4 different sites. We did a variety of thingsdry walling, mucking-out, cleaning up old sub-flooring, insulating, putting together a modular home, painting, remodeling, cooking and other things. Thank you for your continued support. Our next fund-raiser will be the Burger Bash at the Westminster Presbyterian Church, date to be announced.

New Windsor trips: There are two trips being planned to New Windsor this year. One is a youth mission trip (July 28-30) for ages 12-17 (or those just completing their junior year of high school). There is room for 36 youth and adult leaders, so registration is on a first come, first served basis. Both trips involve working one day each at SERRV (inspecting incoming crafts) or the Church World Service warehouse, packing up service projects to send to areas of need.

STOP HUNGER NOW

OCTOBER 18th--That's the date set to package the Stop Hunger meals. PW in Redstone Presbytery has sent over a ton of shoes so far. We've done so well, we have been asked to collect textiles, usable and wearable. So if you didn't get a chance to clean out your closets before the rummage sale, you can still do a lot of good. You can put your items in the Greeting Room and then they will be stored at Phyllis Frye's home until June when there will be a POD in the CUP parking lot. Textiles include all kinds of men's, women's, and children's clothes, linens (towels, sheets, curtains, blankets), handbags, belts. backpacks, wallets, clutches, briefcases, messenger bags, beach bags, totes, carry-on luggage. PW will get 10 cents a pound if over 5000 pounds, 5 cents a pound if less. PW gets 50 cents a pound for shoes. We've been collecting leftover shoes and textiles from rummage sales at other churches. As of now, we have around \$3000.

Other projects in the works are fill the piggy bank with quarters (a quarter buys one meal) at Congruity; A Presbytery-wide Christmas in July Tea on July 26, at Congruity; and the CUP booth (in CUP church) at the New Alexandria Yard Sale .on June 21. There are other plans in the making.
