To the Churches of the Presbytery of Redstone

As you may know from the news, this week a majority of presbyteries have approved the amendment(14-F) to the marriage section in the Directory of Worship which will now make it part of that section of the Book of Order. The language will now describe marriage as a *"unique commitment between two people, traditionally a man and a woman, to love and support each other for the rest of their lives."*

In that same amended section on marriage, it makes clear that "In making this decision, the teaching elder may seek the counsel of the session, which has authority to permit or deny the use of church property for a marriage service." Additionally, it includes the protection of conscience from obligation when it codifies "Nothing herein shall compel a teaching elder to perform nor compel a session to authorize the use of church property for a marriage service that the teaching elder or the session believes is contrary to the teaching elder's or the session's discernment of the Holy Spirit and their understanding of the Word of God."

While I do not believe that anyone will be surprised at the passing of this amendment, nonetheless, there will remain strong convictions on multiple sides of this issue. For those who have advocated for this action, there will be a sense of fulfillment in removing any barriers to their exercise of pastoral and session discretion concerning the pastoral care and marriage of same gender couples. For those who have opposed this action, there will be disappointment and frustration over removing shared boundaries for pastors and sessions that have supported only traditional expressions of marriage.

Within this change in the Book of Order, the path that has been chosen is one that will require mutual forbearance. Certainly, this practice is expected within the body of Christ. There is no doubt that such restraint is far more challenging when the issues with which we disagree with one another are a matter of strong conviction. Yet, it is precisely at those points of greatest difficulty where such forbearance is necessary. Keeping our focus upon the Lord Jesus Christ this side of the kingdom in its fullness, demands not only that we seek to live and think faithfully, but that we do so with humility concerning our own understanding and toward others, especially within the body of Christ.

As we go forward, there will be differences not only over this issue, but plenty of others. Those differences will be apparent not only across our denomination, but within the Presbytery of Redstone. With conviction and with humility, we will need to be able to speak to each other, support one another and pray for each other not only in our similarities, but in our differences. We know that by grace our sovereign God claims us, forgives us, leads us, sanctifies us and will one day purify us.

Two years ago at the March meeting, I attended my first meeting of the Presbytery of Redstone and delivered the sermon. Although I had not officially started, my message focused on the identity of our savior Jesus Christ described in the Gospel of John as being "full of grace and truth." I believe that this description is also an appropriate model for the people of Christ. Not only two years ago, but even more so today, I am convinced and I pray that as a presbytery of God's people connected in this region of the Church that we might be "full of grace and truth."
