

MISSION INTERPRETATION & STEWARDSHIP JOHN BLANK

PAUL'S PERSPECTIVE ON STEWARDSHIP

Session has been reading and studying an excellent book on stewardship written by Rev. Mark Landfried, *This Service of Love.* In chapter 4, Paul's "Instructions to the Galatians," we saw that Paul said, "Every Sunday each of you must put aside some money, in proportion to what he has earned, and save it up, so there will be no need to collect money when I come," (1 Corinthians 16:2) Later in 2 Corinthians 8 & 9 Paul goes into greater depth on the topic. "Giving should be an <u>act of worship</u>; it should be <u>approached systematically</u>; it should be <u>proportionate to income</u>; and it should be <u>planned for in advance</u>." (Landfried p31.)

Over the next several issues of the Congruity Connection we will be taking a closer look at these three points.

Take some time over the next few weeks and read and study First and Second Corinthians and give some prayerful thought to your giving habits.

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

As of the April 19th offering Congruity raised \$724 for the One Great Hour of Sharing. Will we make our goal of \$900?

STATE OF THE GENERAL FUND

At the end of February the General Fund was in a precarious situation. Essentially, Congruity was out of money in the General Fund. Since then we have had some large contributions <u>AND</u> the General Fund offering from Sunday to Sunday has increased. You can see the actual numbers elsewhere in this issue of Congruity Connections.

As I look at the numbers it appears that the deficit in the General Fund will be below \$2000 by the end of April. This is a big improvement over the \$9500 deficit we had at the end of February. We are making progress but still have a way to go to stabilize our financial situation.

CHILD WELFARE CLEARANCES

New regulations in Pennsylvania require all employees and volunteers who have any contact with children to obtain certain clearances. I have set up a website to help guide you through the process. Go to http://elblanko.com/clearances to access the three required clearance checks. Session has authorized reimbursement for any costs incurred by employees and volunteers. Simply submit your receipts to me and I will take care of the reimbursement.

ITEMS FROM SESSION

Session met on April 20, 2015 and reports the following:

- 1) Kathy Hamilton led us in devotions reading from Jim Gilchrist's *Morning by Morning* (based on Thessalonians)
- 2) Approved the Clerk's, Treasurer's, and Moderator's Reports
- 3) Kathy Hamilton was elected as elder delegate to the next meeting of Redstone Presbytery with Dave Foresman as alternative elder delegate.
- 4) The next meeting of Redstone Presbytery will be Tuesday, 5/19/15, starting at 6:00 PM @ West Newton.
- 5) **REMINIDER** of the following tentative dates for fundraisers: Hoagie Sale -5/21/15, Hoagie Sale -9/24/15, and Spaghetti Dinner -11/7/15. All profit, including basket auction and raffle proceeds, to go to the General Fund unless changed by session.
- 6) Session noted that most of the clearances for employees and volunteers have been started or completed.
- 7) **REMINDER** that ALL volunteers working with children, including the nursery during worship and those helping with Vacation Bible School, need to have child welfare clearances. It takes some time for the submissions to be processed, so please do not wait until the last minute.
- 8) Session has set the age for the nursery during worship to children 5 and under.
- 9) MIS reported that the General Fund deficit has been **REDUCED** by approximately \$5500 since the end of February. Congruity still needs your help with balancing the budget. See the MIS article in this issue of Congruity Connections

- 11) Remember: First Fruits = Benevolence = Mission. It is all the same account.
- 12) Noted that plumbing repairs have been made at the manse.
- 13) Discussed the possibility of new lights in the kitchen
- 14) Approved a short term lease of the lower parking lot to Salem Township.
- 15) Awarded bids for moving of the cemetery and the church yard.
- 16) Set summer worship for 10 AM with no Sunday School for June 7 through September 6, inclusive.
- 17) Approved a vacation request from Rev. Foster for July 5 and 6.
- 18) Approved weddings: 7/4 Joe Stopansky; 7/25 Brandy Sellinger; and 8/8 Krystal Kulic
- 19) Agreed to read and study Chapter 5 of *This Service of Love*
- 20) Discussed Chapter 4 of *This Service of Love*
- 21) Noted that the next regular session meeting is scheduled for 5/18/2015.
