PAUL'S PERSPECTIVE ON STEWARDSHIP (Part II)

In Paul's "Instructions to the Galatians," we saw that Paul said, "Every Sunday each of you must put aside some money, in proportion to what he has earned, and save it up, so there will be no need to collect money when I come," (1 Corinthians 16:2) Later in 2 Corinthians 8 & 9 Paul goes into greater depth on the topic. "Giving should be an <u>act of worship</u>; it should be <u>approached systematically</u>; it should be <u>proportionate to income</u>; and it should be <u>planned for in advance</u>." (Landfried p31.)

In this issue I will take a look at the first of these four points: "Giving should be an <u>act of worship...</u>" The offering was to be part of the worship life of a Christian and it was to be received on the day when "the message of the risen Lord was celebrated with joy and with thankful hearts." (Landfried p32.) But how do we do this in actual practice? Do we present our offering with "joy and with thankful hearts" or do we at the last moment as the ushers begin to circulate with the offering plates dig into our wallets or begin writing a check? Do we truly "Praise God from whom all blessings flow..." when we sing the Doxology or are we checking our watches to see if church will end on time? Our offering should be dependent upon and inseparable from our worship life. (*This Service of Love*, Landfried) Submitted by John Blank

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Congruity raised \$864 for the One Great Hour of Sharing. We came very close to our goal of \$900.

PENTECOST OFFERING

60% of the Pentecost Offering (5/17 - 5/31) is used for youth advocacy missions through the PCUSA. Congruity retains 40% of this offering and has designated this portion to go to the Welcome Home Shelter. Our goal for the Pentecost Offering is \$400.

FEEDING THE HUNGRY

Traditionally, the first Sunday of each month is dedicated to feeding the hungry by collecting the Centsability Offering (what was at one time called the 2-cents/meal offering) and by receiving non-perishable food items to go to local families in need. You can either bring your own items or purchase items from the **KID'S STORE**. We are always looking for children to help with the sales.

If you are not at worship on the first Sunday of the month, you can still bring in items at other times. Just put them in the grocery cart in the storage room located at the east end of the greeting room.

State of the General Fund

At the end of February the General Fund was \$9,574.43 in the red. Essentially, Congruity was out of money in the General Fund. Since then we have had some large contributions <u>AND</u> the General Fund offering from Sunday to Sunday has increased. You can see the actual numbers elsewhere in this issue of Congruity Connections.

As of the end of April this deficit was down to just \$385.14 in the red. The Spaghetti Dinner (\$1081 profit) and some large contributions had a significant impact on this reduction in our deficit. We are making progress but still need to prayerfully consider our contributions to the General Fund.



Thanks to all who helped in any way with the Take-out-Turkey Dinner. We cleared about \$1200. We learned a lot, but all in all things went pretty well. There were some glitches that would need to be worked out if we are to have another one. If anyone would still like to make a donation, you may send a check to the Congruity Women's Association. Session met on May 18, 2015 and reports the following:

- 1) Scott McIlnay led us in devotions
- 2) Approved the Clerk's, Treasurer's, and Moderator's Reports
- 3) Kathy Hamilton will serve as elder delegate to the 5/19/2015 of Redstone Presbytery with Dave Foresman as elder delegate. This meeting of Redstone Presbytery will be Tuesday, 5/19/15, starting at 6:00 PM @ West Newton.
- 4) **REMINIDER** of the following tentative dates for fundraisers: Hoagie Sale -5/21/15, Hoagie Sale -9/24/15, and Spaghetti Dinner -11/7/15. All profit, including basket auction and raffle proceeds, to go to the General Fund unless changed by session.
- 5) John Blank reported on the progress with clearances for volunteers and employees.
- 6) **REMINDER** that ALL volunteers working with children, including the nursery during worship and those helping with Vacation Bible School, need to have child welfare clearances. Go to: http://www.elblanko.com/clearances for more information and web links. If you need help with this or printed copies to submit through the US Mail see John Blank. It takes some time for the submissions to be processed, so please do not wait until the last minute.
- 7) Approved participation of the youth in the "30 Hour Famine" activity.
- 8) MIS reported that the General Fund deficit has been **REDUCED** to just a few hundred dollars in the red. Congruity still needs your help with balancing the budget. See the MIS article in this issue of Congruity Connections
- 9) Remember: First Fruits = Benevolence = Mission. It is all the same account.
- 10)MIS reported that as of 5/17 the PDA appeal had received \$85.75 and the Pentecost offering had received \$35.
- 11)MIS reported that \$40 profit from the Kid's Store was given to the Centsability offering.
- 12)Noted that the elevator system passed the semiannual inspection on 5/13/15. Schindler still needs to replace the phone
- 13)Discussed some options to help reduce the high electric bills, especially during the heating months.

14)Noted that all propane service has been switched to AmeriGas.

- 15)Approved insurance coverage for the upcoming year.
- 16)Approved a vacation request from Rev. Foster for September 19-26, 2015
- 17)Approved weddings: 7/4 Joe Stopansky; 7/25 Brandy Sellinger; and 8/8 Krystal Kulic
- 18)Agreed to read and study Chapter 6 of *This Service of Love*
- 19)Discussed Chapter 5 of *This Service of Love*
- 20)Noted that the next regular session meeting is scheduled for 6/22/2015. There will not be a regular session meeting in July. The September meeting of session is set for 9/14/15
