## MISSION INTERPRETATION & STEWARDSHIP

#### PAUL'S PERSPECTIVE ON STEWARDSHIP (Part V)

In Paul's "Instructions to the Galatians," we saw that Paul said, "Every Sunday each of you must put aside some money, in proportion to what he has earned, and save it up, so there will be no need to collect money when I come," (1 Corinthians 16:2) Later in 2 Corinthians 8 & 9 Paul goes into greater depth on the topic. "Giving should be an act of worship; it should be approached systematically; it should be proportionate to income; and it should be planned for in advance." (Landfried p31.)

In this issue I will take a look at the last of these four points: "Giving should be **planned for in advance**" A collection is just that: passing the hat to collect funds for an immediate need. When we carefully think through (and pray through) a decision concerning our giving, plan for that giving in advance, and deliberately prepare for the giving, **THAT IS AN OFFERING.** Stewardship decisions should be made long before entering the church sanctuary.
