

ITEMS FROM SESSION

Session met on October 19, 2015 and reports the following:

- 1) Elder Scott McIlnay led us in devotions reading from Rev. 21: 3-4.
- 2) Approved the Clerk's, Treasurer's, and Moderator's Reports
- 3) John Blank reported that all clearances for volunteers and employees are on file.
- 4) MIS reported that the General Fund was in the red by \$3,899.28 at the end of September.
- 5) Wiring for the ductless heater/AC for the pastor's office has been completed. Thank you Bob Schweppe. The deposit with the contractor for the unit has been mailed.
- 6) The Christian Education Committee reported on plans for the Fall Bonfire (10/24) and the Christmas Program (12/13.)
- 7) Sue Blank reported on the September meeting of Redstone Presbytery and Rev. Foster reported on the October 1st Special Meeting of the Presbytery. The next meeting of Redstone Presbytery is 11/17/15 at the Rehoboth church. Sue Blank was elected elder delegate for that meeting.
- 8) Deacons reported that the Harvest Home collection will finish on 11/22/15 and that the Hanging of the Greens will take place at 10:00 AM on 11/28.
- 9) NEW NEW NEW: Session is responsible for reviewing the minutes of all organizations at least annually. Session decided to do this in January in conjunction with the auditing committee's review of financial records in January
- 10) The Personal Committee met with all employees.
- 11) Session reviewed Rev. Foster's goals for 2015.
- 12) The Nominating Committee is looking for recommendations for elders and deacons.
- 13) We are still in need of someone to learn how to run the projection system for the announcement loop to fill in for John from time to time.
- 14) There will be a mission fair at the Presbytery meeting being held at the Rehoboth Presbyterian Church on November 17. Congregations are encouraged to create displays of the outreach that they are engaged in so that folks can see all of the great things that Redstone congregations are doing!
- 15) Took action to set a Congregational Meeting for 12/6/15 for the purpose of approving the pastor's terms of call, receiving the budget, electing various officers, and electing the nominating committee for 2016.
- 16) Agreed to read and study Chapter F-1 of *The Book of Order*
- 17) Completed our discussion of *This Service of Love*
- 18) The next regular meeting of session is set for 11/16/15

MISSION INTERPRETATION & STEWARDSHIP

FALL STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

Throughout earlier editions of the Congruity Connection I have discussed session's study of Paul's take on stewardship. To recap Paul said, "Every Sunday each of you must put aside some money, in proportion to what he has earned, and save it up, so there will be no need to collect money when I come," (1 Corinthians 16:2) Later in 2 Corinthians 8 & 9 Paul goes into greater depth on the topic. "Giving should be an <u>act of worship</u>; it should be <u>approached systematically</u>; it should be <u>proportionate</u> to income; and it should be <u>planned for in advance</u>." (Landfried p31.)

Please think about those points as you read on.

November is the time of the year when we typically turn our attention to **GIVING THANKS**. The deacons will be collecting food items to be distributed to needy families and many of us will gather around tables later in the month to **GIVE THANKS**. What better way to examine our **THANKFULLNESS** that to take a close look at our individual giving to the church?

Earlier in the year session decided to forgo a formal stewardship campaign but asks that each member take a close prayerful look at his/her/their level of giving to Congruity. If everyone stepped up their level of giving even a little bit we could reduce or even eliminate the deficit in the General Fund. There will not be any pledge cards but we are asking everyone to make that personal, prayerful pledge to increase our offering.

PEACEMAKING OFFERING

During September and the first part of October we received the Peace and Global Witness Offering (Peacemaking Offering.) 25% of our offering will be forwarded to the Blackburn Center. The other 75% will go towards peacemaking projects of the PC (USA.) Congruity's goal for the Peacemaking Offering was \$400 and we received a total of \$320.

FEEDING THE HUNGRY

Don't forget that on the first Sunday of each month we receive the Centsability Offering (what was at one time called the 2-cents/meal offering) and collect non-perishable food items to go to local families in need.

State of the General Fund

The recovery of the General Fund has leveled off. As of the end of September the General fund was \$3,899.28 in the RED. We still need to prayerfully consider our giving in proportion to our income; as an act of worship; to be approached systematically, and planned for in advance.
