The Hebrew word for Peace is Shalom and it conveys much more than simply the absence of war... Shalom also implies well-being, wholeness, safety and security, success and prosperity.

In the midst of the uncertain times in which we live, may the Prince of Peace fill us with the assurance of the embracing arms of God's love and God's presence with us through each and every step we take along the road of life. In the midst of the hustle and bustle of getting ready for Christmas, may the Prince of Peace fill our lives.

Session met on November 16, 2015 and reports the following:

- 1) Elder Sue Blank led us in devotions reading from Luke 17: 11-19.
- 2) Approved the Clerk's, Treasurer's, and Moderator's Reports
- 3) MIS reported that the General Fund was in the red by \$5,171.83 at the end of October.
- 4) The Christian Education Committee reported on plans for the Christmas Program (12/13.)
- 5) Presbytery met on 11/17/15 with Sue Blank serving as elder delegate
- 6) Deacons reported that the Harvest Home collection finished on 11/22/15 with distribution to needy families and that the Hanging of the Greens will take place at 10:00 AM on 11/28.
- 7) **NEW NEW NEW:** Session is responsible for reviewing the minutes of all organizations at least annually. Session decided to do this in January in conjunction with the auditing committee's review of financial records in January
- 8) Reminder: Congregational Meeting on 12/6/15 at the end or worship.
- 9) Session reviewed the MIS committee recommendation for Rev. Foster's terms of call. The congregation will vote on these terms of call at the congregational meeting on 12/6/15.
- 10) Took action to set Congruity's pledge to the wider church through the First Fruits Offering at \$7,800.00.
- 11) Took action to recommend a change in the by-laws that would permit the treasurers and financial secretaries to serve more than 10 consecutive years noting that they will still be elected for one year terms. The change will be read at the 12/6/15 Congregational Meeting and will be voted on at the Congregational Meeting in January.
- 12) Approved the budget for 2016. The budget will be presented to the congregation for information at the 12/6/15 Congregational Meeting
- 13) Approved the slate of nominees for various offices. The election will be part of the Congregational Meeting on 12/6/15.
- 14) Set the following goals for the 2016 special offerings as follows: One Great Hour of Sharing \$900; Pentecost Offering \$375 with the local portion (40%) to go to the Blackburn Center; Peace and Global Witness \$375 with the local portion (25%) to go to the Welcome Home Shelter; and the Christmas Joy Offering \$375.
- 15) Appointed to the Class of 2016: John Blank, Clerk; Jim Kepple, Asst. Clerk; John Blank, Treasurer (6th Year); and Caroline D'Aurora, Asst. Treasurer.
- 16) Agreed to read and study Chapter F-2 and F-3 of *The Book of Order*
- 17) Completed our discussion of Chapter F-1 of *The Book of Order*
- 18) The next regular meeting of session is set for 12/14/15

MISSION INTERPRETATION & STEWARDSHIP JOHN BLANK



FALL STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

Earlier in the year session decided to forgo a formal stewardship campaign but asks that each member take a close prayerful look at his/her/their level of giving to Congruity. If everyone stepped up their level of giving even a little bit we could reduce or even eliminate the deficit in the General Fund. If each "giving unit" would increase it's their level of giving by just \$2.50 per week we would eliminate the deficit in the general fund.

There will not be any pledge cards but we are asking everyone to make that personal, prayerful pledge to increase his/her offering. Recently I saw a card that shows 5 steps to giving:

- 1) Give for the first time If you have never given to the work of God
- 2) Give consistently Start giving on a consistent basis
- 3) Give intentionally Increase you percentage giving on a regular basis
- 4) Give a Tithe Purposefully give 10% of your net income
- 5) Give Sacrificially Give beyond 10% as God prompts you

UNDERSTANDING THE FINANCIAL REPORT

There are five columns to the General Fund report. The first column lists the 12 months of the year. The second column lists the net receipts for that month and the third column lists the net expenses for the month. The fourth column lists the "Actual Balance" in the general fund. At the beginning of 2015 there was \$12,938.26 in the general fund. By the end of October the balance had dwindled down to \$7,766.43. The fifth and last column lists the "To Date Balance." This is the state of the general fund for this calendar year, 2015. I hope this helps and please talk to me if you need a further explanation.

FEEDING THE HUNGRY

Don't forget that on the first Sunday of each month we receive the Centsability Offering (what was at one time called the 2-cents/meal offering) and collect non-perishable food items to go to local families in need.
