Cliff's Notes



A couple of weeks ago as I was doing some research for an on-line video for our recently held Elder-Deacon joint meeting, I came across a Vlog by Landon Whitsett, who is the Synod Executive of the Synod of Mid-America. In one of his daily video logs he was driving down a highway and up ahead there was smoke covering the road. As he neared the smoke he discovered that it was what he called "a controlled burn". A control burn is something that farmers and ranchers in the Midwest and on the Plains do in order to get the ground ready for spring planting. It involves burning off all of the stuff that was left in the fields over the winter months. I have been thinking a lot of the image of "a controlled burn" especially in the light of the Season of Lent.

An important part of our Lenten journey is preparing ourselves to be receptive to all that God has done for us in the life, death and resurrection of Christ. Each of us has our own particular things we do during the Lenten Season—some of us have given something up and others of us have added something new to our daily disciplines—to help us remember and perhaps experience all that Christ went through for us. I like the concept of "a controlled burn" because it enables us to get rid of those things in our lives that are weighing us down, those things that prevent us from functioning to the best of our ability, those things that seem to always be part of my New Year's Resolutions or Lenten practices. The image of a field intentionally burned so that new growth is possible is a powerful reminder to us of the message of Easter... that new life is possible through our faith in Christ!

Throughout this month we will continue towards the empty tomb of Easter and we will celebrate Easter on March 27th. It is my hope and prayer that as we are surrounded by the symphony of springtime with new life, renewed life bursting forth all around us, that the image of "a controlled burn" fills us with hope because of the new life that is ours through our faith in Jesus Christ. The image of "a controlled burn" reminds me of those words of Paul in 2 Corinthians 5: 17: "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!"

I would like to wish each of you a very Blessed Easter!
