I remember back in the late summer/early fall when the Old Farmer's Almanac's prediction for this winter was first announced. If I remember correctly, it was supposed to be a rough winter, with below average cold and above average snowfall. Well, many of us are thankful that that prediction did not materialize. Although, I have made the comment along with others that since we had March weather in January, I hope we don't have January weather in March! One of the things that I have been thinking about over the last several weeks is how none of us knows for sure what each new day will bring our way. Be it in terms of weather, or the twists and turns of life, waiting for the results of tests and procedures that have been done, anxiously waiting the word from our doctor. Who would have thought that we would have the windows open and temperatures in the 70's in Western PA at the end of February?

As we enter the month of March, we commence on our journey through the Season of Lent. Lent affords us the opportunity to spend some time reflecting upon and thinking about the depth of God's love shown to us in Jesus Christ. The Lenten journey will conclude as we stand before the empty tomb of Easter and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ... but before we get there, our journey will take us to those Jerusalem streets where palm branches are being waved and placed on the road... to the Upper Room to share the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday and we will endure the sadness and darkness of Good Friday as Jesus hangs on the cross. Then we will wait to hear the startling Good News that the tomb is empty, that Christ is alive, that he has risen from the dead. I was thinking about the Season of Lent the other day in terms of how it is symbolic of our lives and the things we that go through within our lives. As people of faith, we look forward to the Good News of Easter even in the midst of the twists and turns, the ups and downs, the darkness that sometimes creeps into our lives. Our faith gives us the assurance of that which Paul writes of in Romans 14: 8 "If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's". The Brief Statement of Faith in our Book of Confessions puts it this way: "In life and death we belong to God".

I would challenge all of us to spend some time reflecting on this during the Season of Lent—that we belong to God! Throughout Lent we will be having our Community Lenten Services on Wednesday evenings at 7 PM at the various churches in our area. There is a schedule of these services in this Newsletter. I hope that as we are surrounded by the signs of Spring, that each of us experience anew the depth of God's love for each one of us.
