Cliff made 28 visits and attended several church functions and Presbytery functions including the September Presbytery Meeting at Pine Springs.

Sarabeth Stopansky was the Elder Delegate and reported that Pine Springs has reached the goal of \$1,800,000 that had been set for the Capitol Campaign. Rev Ed Gray was approved as the pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Murrysville. Rev Foster will take part in the Installation and be Rev. Gray's mentor for the next 6 months.
