The Session met Monday, February 17, 2020 and reports the following items:

- Approved A request from Becky Davis for a memorial plaque in honor of Ronda Weinell.
- Approved the following dates for spaghetti Dinners May 2nd and November 14th.
- Approved goals for Special Offerings for 2020. OGHS-\$1000, Pentecost-\$400, Peace and Global Witness-\$375 and Joy-\$400.
- Approve Rev. Foster's vacation request for April 13-19. This is 7 days including 1 Sunday.
- Voted to rescind the vote that approved using Congruity as a drop off station for Operation Shoebox. John Blank brought some concerns to MIS asking them to revisit the decision and provided Session with several articles about the organization, the usefulness of the items sent in the shoeboxes and several alternative options to help those in need both locally and worldwide.
- Voted to have a Lenten program for children. The children will be excused after the Children's Sermon and work on a few projects for Palm Sunday and Easter.
- Voted to only have one Service on Easter Sunday. Breakfast will be served at 8:30 AM and Worship will be at 10:00 AM. The Children will take part in that Service. Post cards will be sent out reminding folks of all worship opportunities from Palm Sunday-Easter and Highlighting the time change.
- Heard from Sue Derek and Dave Foresman about a training session they attended on Church Safety issues. The Session and Deacons will investigate to this further at their joint meeting next month.
