The Session met on Monday, May 18, 2020 and reports the following:

- We will wait to start in person Worship until the state enters in to the green phase. Please watch your mail for a post card that will inform you of the date and time of our first in person worship.
- There has been a very positive response to the weekly social media meditations. Some sort of Facebook/you tube devotions will continue.
- Discussed the progress made on the pavilion.

- Session verified the following items that were approved by phone/email during the stay at home time:

- Voted to make Bob and Kaye Frye Affiliate Members. Bob and Kaye live in Florida but have a strong connection to Congruity. We welcome them.
- Voted to move the start of Worship to 10:00 AM for the summer months.

MISSION INTERPRETATION + STEWARDSHIP by tim d'aurora

We are thrilled to acknowledge the tremendous response from the members and friends of Congruity Presbyterian Church. I was extremely concerned with what appeared to be a dismal future for our church with no inperson worship services for an extended period. I made the assumption that if the people weren't here to make their contributions, they would be likely to give a lot less. Everyone is proving me wrong! At the end of April, our financial situation is much healthier than expected and we took in significantly more than our expenses. Our year to date total was reduced to a negative balance of - \$2,519.89. While significant, this compares very favorably with the end of April balance last year of -\$11,767.70. Again, I commend everyone on their fantastic support and hope we maintain this momentum! We continue to ask you to prayerfully consider your continued giving.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE BY TIM D'AURORA

Changes are happening on the church grounds. Next time you are in the neighborhood, take a look at the progress on our new outdoor pavilion!



I'm excited to report we hope to have it completed within several weeks. The pavilion was designed to complement the existing church and will be lighted and have power outlets. As always, there is a concern over finances. When the Session first approved this project, we thought the Memorial Fund account of \$32,196 would cover all associated costs. Major contributions in memory of three members totaling \$6,515.00 are designated for the pavilion, but at least \$3,000 will be used to upgrade the sound system in the sanctuary. While the initial bid for the pavilion was \$26,760, there will be additional costs for the electrical meter installation, connections and some material costs. We need to ask our members and friends to once again step up and respond for this long lasting and positive addition for our Church family. Please prayerfully consider making a donation to the pavilion'. Thank you!
