ITEMS FROM SESSION/DEACONS

The Session met Monday, August 17, 2020 and reports the following:

Marsha Stallings, the Committee on Ministry Liaison to Congruity attended the meeting and brought greetings from the Presbytery. Marsha also read the 2019 Minutes and reviewed the Church Register and found them in order.

Rev. Foster reported: May Presbytery Meeting was held by Zoom due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. Rev. Laura Blank, Rev. Sue Blank, Elder Bobbie Jo Huebner and Elder Josh Scully were commissioned and will be attending GA virtually. Rev. Brian Kilbert was installed as the new Pastor at Puckety in Lower Burrell. Pine Springs made the hard decision to cancel camp for the summer.

Rev.Foster reported that he had officiated at 2 funerals: Red Goodnights on 5/29/2020, and Dorothy Martz on 6/19/2020. He also officiated at a Memorial Service for Janet Henry on 7/25/2020.

The Property Committee reported that the elevator is finally repaired. The AC unit in Fellowship Hall was also repaired. The new Sound system was installed in the Sanctuary. The work on the pavilion is coming along.

There will be no Sunday School until further notice

The door to Fellowship Hall will be locked unless the hall is in use. The exception being Sunday morning, the door will be unlocked for folks that need to use the elevator. The door will be locked once Worship starts.

Session Approved the following items:

- Rev. Foster's vacation request for October 11-18, 2020.
- Rev Foster's request to officiate at the Kepple/Fink wedding on September 26, 2020
- Elected Kathy Hamilton to be Elder Delegate to the September 22, 2020 Presbytery Meeting.
- The cleaning of the carpet in Fellowship Hall, the kitchenette and upstairs hallway. This work will be scheduled in the next couple weeks.
- The Women's Association's request to hold a Take-Out Turkey Dinner on October 10th. The women provided a plan that includes implementing several safety precautions. All dinners will be takeout with pre paid tickets there will be a takeout station in the parking, no one but workers will be in the church.

The Start time of Worship will be moved back to 11:00 AM starting September 13th. There will be Communion using individually prepackaged elements as a safety precaution.

MISSION BY PHYLLIS FRYE

Ten members of the **Redstone Mission Team** "stepped out in faith" and travelled to Mercer, Pa to **Root International**, a faith-based collection point for a wide variety of donations to be sent to West Virginia, El Paso, Texas (to supply missions in Texas, Mexico, and the Navajo Nation), Ghana and locally. The main purpose was a paint job that needed to be done. Dave and John went to great heights to do that while the rest of us stayed grounded and packed clothing, backpacks, and household goods. Root supplied us with a light breakfast and lunch and also gave us a tour of their facilities. Root's property was once the site of a hospital complex. Those going from Congruity were Dave Foresman, John and Carole Johnson, Sue Derek, Ced Stopansky and Phyllis Frye. Others were Lynn Ticherich, Duffy Greba and Glenn and Patti Hart. The Redstone Mission Team plans on taking another load of donations in September.

We are still <u>collecting donations</u> of linens (bedding, towels), winter outerwear (coats, gloves, hats, heavy hoodies, flannel jackets, scarves) for men, women and children until Sunday, Sept 13. We will also be taking any excess school supplies left after our Sunday School kids' bags are filled. These will be taken to Root international in September.

<u>Thank you</u> all for the generous outpouring of school supply donations. We were able to fill 16 bags for our Sunday school kids and still have some left to send to Root International

MISSION INTERPRETATION + STEWARDSHIP BY TIM D'AURORA

Once again we want to thank everyone who has helped maintain our financial position. When we resumed in person worship, we weren't sure what response we would get. While our attendance has only been between 20 and 30 people, the giving has remained fairly strong. If you exclude the PPP Loan we received, our to-date balance for the end of July would be -\$1,337.00. While that might not sound positive, if you compare it to last year's year to-date total at the end of July of -\$6494.69, we are in a much better financial position for the year. And due to our higher return of per capita money, we are still showing a positive First Fruits balance. **Please continue your strong support!**

One area where we are severely lacking is with our **Special Offerings**. We were in the middle of our <u>One Great Hour of Sharing</u> collection when we stopped in person worship, and only received \$384.00 of our \$1,000.00 goal. Then we missed the <u>Pentecost</u> offering where our goal was \$400.00 and will soon begin our <u>Peace and Global Witness</u> collection. Our goal for this year is \$375.00. You can still support each of these worthy causes by making a donation and marking it for which Special Offering you want to designate it to. We have a strong history of supporting these Special Offerings and I hope this year won't be an exception.

If you have been past the church recently, you probably noticed the progress on the **Pavilion**. We want to remind everyone that we are soliciting additional funds to finish paying for this project. This should be a great resource for our Church for many years. We will be providing information in the future for those that want to provide picnic tables in memory of someone or for other memorial opportunities.
