
WEEKLY WORSHIP SERVICES FOR DE-CEMBER

The session met on November 23rd and reports the following. Cliff reported that he and his family are feeling well after their Covid 19 quarantine. He thanked everyone for their texts, calls and prayers.

Approved the budget for 2021 with the exception of pastor's terms of call.

Moved to recommend the MIS Committee's suggested terms of call to the congregation to vote on at the December 6th Congregational Meeting.

## MISSION INTERPRETATION + STEWARDSHIP BY TIM D'AURORA

For many months this year, I have been thanking everyone for their tremendous response in these incredibly trying times. We have been able to maintain a pretty strong financial position even though I was very concerned about our ability to do so. You all proved me wrong. Unfortunately, that strong position has been compromised. The last 2 months have seen a significant increase in expenditures while receipts have declined. Excluding our paycheck protection program money, we would now have a -8,175.04 year-to-date balance deficit. This is very concerning. In normal years (I know, this is 2020), November and December are 2 of our strongest months financially. Unfortunately, this year, that will probably not be the case. With having to cancel 2 in-person worship services in November, and canceling the Christmas Eve Service (which is one of our highest attended services), we are looking at a major financial shortfall. First Fruits has also been hit hard. It now has a -126.68 year-to-date balance. So I'm back to saying "The sky is falling" again. We need your help. Prayerfully consider your gifts and if you are able to do so, please give a little extra. Think of it as your Christmas gift to the Church. An extra \$10, \$25, \$50, or \$100 would go a long way in helping out this year.

I also want to remind everyone that we will be collecting our **Christmas Joy Offering**. This year we set a goal of \$400.00. With the strange circumstances this year, we have missed our goals on our other special offerings. Let's end the year on a high note and meet this one.

On a positive note, I want to thank everyone who helped with our Hoagie Sale. This time we changed it up a little and made the hoagies on Friday and then sold extra hoagies to the public at 2 locations. Thanks to First Commonwealth Bank in New Alexandria for giving us permission to sell there. This proved to be a successful strategy. Not only did we sell over 100 hoagies ourselves (Dave & Pam Foresman were our big sellers), but we sold well over 100 on Saturday. I strongly believe that with this combined approach, with a little more notice and some better planning, we can easily sell 300 hoagies. This allowed us to make a profit of over \$700.00. Many thanks to everyone who bought and sold hoagies and to those that came Friday to help assemble them. It is only successful when many participate. Great job!!
