I would like to wish all the dads a happy Father's Day as well as to all the men who have provided a role-model or guidance to others. The other day, I found myself thinking about my own dad and reflecting on what we call "Howard's Rules". My dad was a firefighter in my hometown, and he gave us rules to follow to ensure our safety and the safety of our home and to a wider extent our community. Those rules included a whole gamut of areas, things like it was ok to leave outdoor Christmas lights on but not the tree when we were not home to always having a box of baking soda handy for a grease fire in the oven or on the stove. I remember always having clothes ready to jump into in the middle of the night, if we had to evacuate the house in a hurry, almost like a firefighter's bunker gear. I find myself thinking about "Howard's Rules" quite often and the lessons that I learned and continue to learn from my dad.

The other day it occurred to me that like my dad, Jesus gave us many lessons for us to put into effect in our lives to help us live out our faith as we traverse the road of life. In Matthew 22 we read of a lawyer who asked Jesus a question: "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus responded, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'." (Matthew 22: 36-39). Alan Jackson in his song "Where Were You" has this line: "But I know Jesus and I talk to God And I remember this from when I was young ... Faith, hope, and love are some good things He gave us ... And the greatest is love."

In the living of our lives, may we incorporate these words of Jesus, this powerful "Rule" into our lives. Can you image just for a moment the impact we could make in the world by loving God with our whole being and loving one another as ourselves!
