

Approved the outdoor summer Bible Study in the Pavilion for Thursday evenings in July and August.


Gave permission to the Women's Association to explore having a Fall Turkey Dinner.



MISSION INTERPRETATION + STEWARDSHIP BY TIM D'AURORA


It's time for our second Hoagie Sale of the year. We will be doing three this year. We will be meeting on Friday, July 30 at 5:30pm to assemble the hoagies. We will again be taking additional hoagies to First Commonwealth Bank in New Alexandria, the BP at Five Points, and hopefully the Rite Aid in Delmont to sell to the general public on Saturday. We need your help. First to Sell, Sell, Sell. There is an **order form** in this newsletter as well as additional copies in the Greeting Room at church. Turn these order forms in to Tim either at church or by calling your totals in by Monday evening. Then we need help to assemble the hoagies. The more the merrier. We hope to be making around 250-300 hoagies so we could use more bodies than usual. Finally, we could use a couple of people to help sell hoagies on Saturday. Last time we were there from around 10:00am to around noon and were able to sell all the hoagies. Let Tim know if you would be willing to help Friday evening and if you are able to help at a location. As you can see from our financial reports, we are struggling a bit. This is a great opportunity to generate some income for the General Fund.

As referenced above, the financial news is not great. While we had tremendous response at the height of the pandemic, I wonder if people are now taking things for granted. Even though we have had in person worship for a good while now, we still have fairly low attendance. I believe in the past year, we had many people step up to try and cover any shortfalls we might have. We certainly could use that again. At the end of May, we are \$10,489.13 in the red. This is the worst financial position we have been in for quite awhile. Please prayerfully consider your level of giving.

I thought I would include one more reminder about the Per Capita collection. Remember, it is per person, not per family and is \$42.50 each. This should be over and above your normal giving. This is the money that supports our higher levels of church government and the Presbytery's mission involvement. We seem to be somewhat behind our collections from last year as we have only collected \$1,826.90 through May. If everyone on the rolls paid their Per Capita, we would collect over \$5,500.00. As you can see, that is a significant shortfall.

Ending on a positive note, we did exceed our \$400.00 goal for the Pentecost Special Offering by \$87.11. Thanks to everyone who donated to this worthwhile cause.
