God is always with us and we have one other, our sisters and brothers, because together we are the Body of Christ—the Church.


Our most recent hoagie sale in July was a tremendous success thanks to the greater than expected number of orders. Please do the same great job selling. In July, we made **300 hoagies** and made a profit for the general fund of over \$1,000. That's fantastic. I want to thank everyone who made that possible. Those of you who sold did a great job. I know a few felt there numbers were down, but when combined with everyone, we had **orders for over 180**. Then on the evening we met to assemble the hoagies, it started a little slow and I thought we were in for a long night. But several more people showed up and it turned out to be a great crew. Then on Saturday, we had **3 locations selling** the remainder of the hoagies. We learned a few things and I think we can be a little more aggressive this time and do an even better job. Please use the order form found in the newsletter or in the Greeting Room at the back of the sanctuary. **It only works with everyone's help.**

I would be remiss in my duties if I didn't bring our current financial situation to everyone's attention. Please take a look at the financial report John provides. Unfortunately, it shows a trend in the wrong direction. Our general fund is in the negative by \$12,972.91 for the year. While we generally start to do a little better in the fall, we have a lot of ground to make up. Our First Fruits is just staying even with the budget and that is after we reduced our goal for this year. Please prayerfully consider your giving and, if possible, do what you can to help reduce our deficit.

On a positive note, we voted to donate \$75 each to the 3 local fire departments to support the great work they do. This money comes from our local mission fund.
