# **Congruity Connections**

#### **CLIFF'S NOTES**

Over the last few days I have found myself thinking about our upcoming celebration of Pentecost on June 5, 2022. Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Church of Jesus Christ. We remember the Holy Spirit was poured out on the disciples, there was a sound of a rush of wind, tongues of fire rested on the disciples who began to speak in various languages as they shared the Gospel message with all those who were in Jerusalem. The story of Pentecost is a powerful story and I think that it speaks as loudly today as it all those years ago.

I think we can see some similarities to the disciples in the Book of Acts and us today as we celebrate Pentecost. With the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the disciples went out and literally changed the course of human history with the Gospel message. As we look towards a post-Covid future there are several questions for us to think about: How will be answer our call to go into all the world to make disciples? What will the landscape look like as we engage in ministry and mission? What lessons have we learned over the last couple of years that will impact how we are the Church in the future? One of the things that we have learned over the last couple of years is that we have been challenged and the words "we never did it that way before" must likely no longer apply to us as we have creatively discovered new ways to worship, conduct meeting and be engaged in the business of building God's kingdom in our communities in the midst of a global pandemic.

When Peter preached on Pentecost he used Joel 2 as his text—which includes these words: "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams." What are our dreams and visions as we look towards the future? Are we living in the midst of another Pentecost as God's Spirit is pushing us to a new understanding of what it means to be the Church of Jesus Christ? How will be faithful to our calling in the midst of a changed landscape? Just as the disciples filled with the Holy Spirit went out and changed the world, will we change the world for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in a post-Covid world? As we journey into a post-pandemic future, may we be filled with God's Spirit as we shared the Gospel message to all those around us. As we gather on June 5, 2022, I would remind you to wear something red as we

celebrate Pentecost.



# REDSTONE MISSION TEAM REPORT CONTINUED

In April, the Redstone Mission Team made a trip to **Summersville WV** where they completed several projects on a double-wide home tearing down a small porch, raising the floor, rebuilding the railing and adding a 16ft wheelchair ramp.

We also covered the back half of the shingled roof with metal roofing, redid all the vents, and finished putting metal trim around the roof. Work included some skirting around the back. After that project was complete, some of the team worked on closing in the underside of the roof on a building next to the church which is used as a food pantry, while some of the women drove 35 min away to Richwood to help sort clothes at mission called 'Start-up'. This is run by the Nicholas County Empowerment Corp and includes a food kitchen, food pantry, counselling, therapy programs and a thrift store.

The team was 12 volunteers from six churches, including two retired ministers with no affiliation. Some of the team went on Saturday and did the grocery shopping and were able to join the host church and enjoy "Holy Humor" Sunday followed by a picnic lunch at Summersville Lake. We started each day at 6 or 7 am with breakfast and were ready for work by 8am. Working until 4pm, we stopped for showers and supper, then devotions and some free time. It was a very rewarding week.


