CLIFF'S NOTES

One of the threads that is woven into the fabric of my life is being the son of a firefighter. Hearing the tones of a call coming in on the scanner at all hours of the day or night was part of my life when I was growing up. The camaraderie that exists among firefighters is a strong bond. This is very evident when a firefighter dies in the line of duty. On May 11th, my cousin Rob died after a 3year long battle with cancer. Rob was a firefighter on Worcester Fire Department for 29 years in Massachusetts and his cancer is believed to be a result of line of duty. I was not able to attend his funeral, but I saw many pictures of the service and how many firefighters dressed in their Class A uniforms lined the streets to honor his service to the community. I am sure that each of us have seen a funeral service of a line of duty death of a public servant—a police officer, a firefighter, and military personnel. Those services are very moving.

Over the last few weeks, I have been thinking about the images of my cousin Rob's funeral service. I find myself thinking of those words of Paul in 1 Corinthians 12 where Paul is talking about the body of Christ—the Church and in verse 26 he says, "If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it." I think this is a wonderful image for us to hold onto of the Church... of each one of us being there for one another no matter what we may be going through.

As we live into our call to be the Church in this community in a post-pandemic world, may that image that Paul gives us and the image of the camaraderie among public servants enable us to continue to be there for one another. May we living into our call to be the body of Christ—the Church at work in our world today.

I would also like to wish all the dads a very Happy Father's Day. I would also like to wish all of the graduates success in all your future endeavors.



I wanted to thank everyone who helped make our latest HOAGIE SALE a success. We did a good job selling. We exceeded our presale quantity from last time by more than 20. That meant we had less to sell on Saturday. We had a great crew to help assemble hoagies including several that aren't even members and we owe them a ton of appreciation. And Becky, Thom, Dot, and her friend Sue did a great job in the rain on Saturday selling the remainder within an hour.

We sold 250 hoagies and will probably try to do even more in July when we do another one. It looks like we will make a profit of around \$800 which is one of our best ever. The new hoagie buns were slightly larger than our previous ones, so we are looking at our options to add more meat and raise the price a little. Almost everyone else selling hoagies are at least \$8.00 so we should be fine. **More details to follow!**

If you look at the financial reports, you will notice that thanks to 5 Sundays and Easter, our receipts exceeded our expenses by almost \$140.00. This was certainly a positive though we remain \$8,583.28 in the negative year to date. The other positive was our **First Fruits** remained ahead of budget by \$1,175. And we exceeded our goal for the **One Great Hour of Sharing** as we collected \$1,021. **Great job, everyone!!**

The final profit from the **Spaghetti Dinner** turned out to be \$1,184. Considering the lower than expected turnout, this was a great result. Thanks again to everyone who helped.




SANCTUARY ROOF: We awarded the job of replacing the older part of the church roof to Big Run Roofing who had the lowest bid of \$15,800. While this is a lot of money, it is a good bit under our initial estimates. We still need everyones' help. **If you are able, we would appreciate your dona-**

tions earmarked for the building fund. Even if you don't feel you can give a lot, it was suggested you "buy a bundle of shingles". The average bundle of shingles is around \$40. - To Wild and Wonderful West Virginia!

April 16 - 21, 2023.

For this [latest] mission trip (see May's Congruity Connections for photos), we traveled to St. Albans, near Charleston. It was a great location - the St. Albans Presbyterian Church is only a few minutes away from our work site at 627 Rust Street. Just a word about the house we worked on. It was a gift to the community from Eugene Hezekiah Washington. When it is finished, the plan is for it to be a kind of halfway house with a focus on those who are trying to break the cycle of substance abuse. The need in the community for this kind of ministry was brought home to us by the presence just up the lane of a very large homeless encampment.

The house needs a bit of work, but Jack Rogers our coordinator was helpful in pointing us towards how to bring things up to par. Our time there was spent addressing both structural issues, and working to make the house more livable.

Our excellent engineering department of Dave, Ed, and Cedric spent a bunch of their time straightening a back wall, and tidying up some siding issues. We had a painting crew of Sylvia, Patty, Lynne, and Becky who not only dressed up some furniture, they also worked on a porch/ramp. Sue and Chuck had fun framing out windows and using power tools.

The weather was great, and we were blessed with what we felt was a fruitful trip. A real bonus was that we were able to spend time with the Hezekiah House 'sponsor,' Pastor Michael Poke of the St. Paul's Missionary Baptist Church. We were impressed with his commitment and enthusiasm for serving Christ. By the way, the concept of this house was based on one that was started in Baltimore by a priest whose brother served the community in St. Albans.

We were blessed to enjoy the hospitality of Pastor Mark, Mike the custodian, Christina the office manager, all of the St. Albans Church, and we met a very special waitress - Kylie of Shucker's Restaurant. Many thanks are owed to the folks back home who helped us by sponsoring, supporting and praying for our time away. All in all, we feel we were able to keep the focus on the future of ministry in the Charleston area, as well as in Redstone Presbytery. We are grateful to the Lord who gave us the opportunity to share the love and grace we have received.
