Approved the Redstone Mission Team's use of the kitchen for a Soup Sale in October.


Voted to cancel the July Session meeting.

Turkey & Swiss: Turkey, swiss cheese, lettuce, tomato



BUDGET+STEWARDSHIP+INTERPRETATION BY TIM D'AURORA

Since this newsletter covers 2 months, we want to make everyone aware of our upcoming activities. As you can see from the financial reports, any positive we saw from April has been wiped away. Unfortunately, May saw a negative \$2,631 hit on our general fund. This technically leaves us with a negative general fund balance. And as we go into our summer months, we normally see even less giving while our expenses remain fairly constant. So we need to appeal to everyone to do what they can to help out. In an effort to raise additional funds, we are adding a hoagie sale in July and a spaghetti dinner in August. Obviously, we need to do all we can to make both of these fundraisers as successful as possible.

On Friday, July 14th, we will get together to assemble hoagies beginning at around 4:30. Last time, we had a nice turnout to help and we hope everyone can show up again as we hope to do an additional 25 hoagies. The hoagie price went up by a dollar because we are adding



more meat and cheese. At \$8.00, this is still a great value for the quality of the hoagie everyone receives. Pickup begins at 6:00pm. On Saturday, we will sell additional hoagies at First Commonwealth Bank in New Alexandria and at the BP at Five Points starting at around 10:00 am. As always, this sale is only as successful as **YOU** make it. So get out there and sell, sell, sell and then help with the assembly.
