The end of Sept Phyllis Frye, Ced Stopansky, Becky Moore helped Ron Elsbury and his friend Ron at **Mantle House Mission (1)** to help construct a building for a new store, where we put on siding, set in some windows, built in a stairway, insulated and did general clean-up. In October, Sue Derek, Judy Koontz, Patti Hart, Phyllis Frye went to **ROOT International** in Mercer County and loaded boxes (2,3,4) from a trailer (which the team had gutted and floored) to a U-Haul and took it to a warehouse in Polk and unloaded it onto a warehouse floor, then divided the boxes by location to either Mexico or Navajo and put them on skids to be shrink wrapped and stored until they are put on a trailer truck and shipped to El Paso the end of the month. It was heavy work, but we did it! Please pray for safe travels for both the truck driver and for Becky Vogan, who will be flying out with her 96 year-old mother the beginning of November.

Spaghetti Our next fundraiser is a spaghetti dinner. Yes, it's back.


It will be on Saturday, November 11th from 4:00 pm to 6:30 pm.
