

The Session will be meeting next on December 18th at 7PM.


DEACONS BY DAVE FORESMAN

For the past 16 years, Congruity Women have supported a compassion child from Haiti. Her name is **Chaclenta Francois**. She has reached her 22nd birthday and has now **graduated from the program**. Her plan is to become a nurse and take care of those in her community. She asks us to pray for her "so that God can preserve my life and succeed in school and keep me in His love". Haiti is not a safe place to be, so please keep her in prayers.

BUDGET+STEWARDSHIP+INTERPRETATION BY TIM D'AURORA

I want to thank everyone who helped make our most recent spaghetti dinner such a success. We



served about 175 people including 14 Veterans that were not charged for their meal. We had separate donations that almost covered this cost. We had a great group of volunteers that helped keep everything run smoothly. We also had a tremendous response to our basket raffle. We had 28 baskets and raised close to \$700 on the baskets alone. Together with the dinner receipts, we were able to achieve a profit of \$1500. Great job, everyone.

A look at the financial statements show our overall financial condition has not improved. In fact, it has gotten even worse. At the end of October, we had a deficit of \$9,194.18. Usually our November and December numbers improve our situation, but this is a very deep hole. We need everyone to prayerfully consider their giving and if you can make any additional contribution, it would be a help. This also includes our First Fruits donations. We are very slightly behind our projected levels to achieve our pledge. With your help, we will reach this.



At our upcoming Congregational Meeting, December 3rd, we will be presenting the 2024 budget. As in years past, this is a bare bones budget that really has no room for reduction. You can note that 66% of our overall budget is for employee costs. Between that and the physical costs of maintaining and heating our building, we are already over \$100,000. Our only hope for continued existence is to increase our revenue. In these difficult times, it is difficult to ask for people to contribute even more. We have increased our number of hoagie sales and spaghetti dinners and while this is a help, it isn't the answer. We will continue to face some difficult challenges in the future. We will look for additional avenues to help lessen this burden.

We installed doors, finished trim, set patio stones, painted, trimmed doors and floors, fashioned and installed a vent, glazed a window ,did some carpenter work, and some other things. Ced, Gene and Dave went to a trailer and reset a set of outside steps and replaced a rotten subfloor. When they pulled back the carpet, an o'possum stuck its nose out! Hezekiah House is almost finished, but due to finances, it may be a while before it is ready for use. They still need a refrigerator and carpet throughout and a fire escape, which they have, but needs to be installed. Countertops were to come the following week. 
